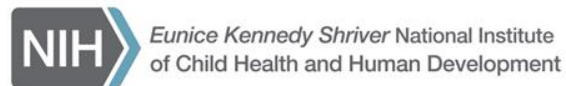

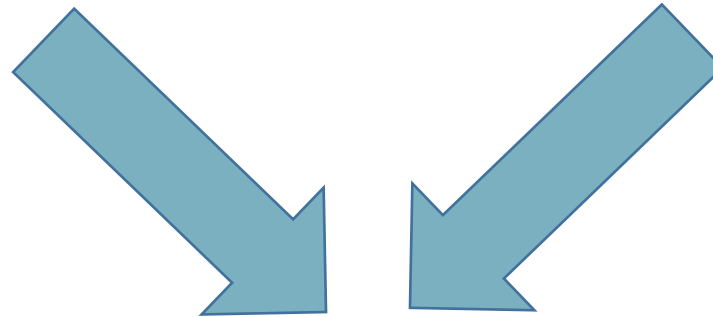
Contraception Research at NICHD

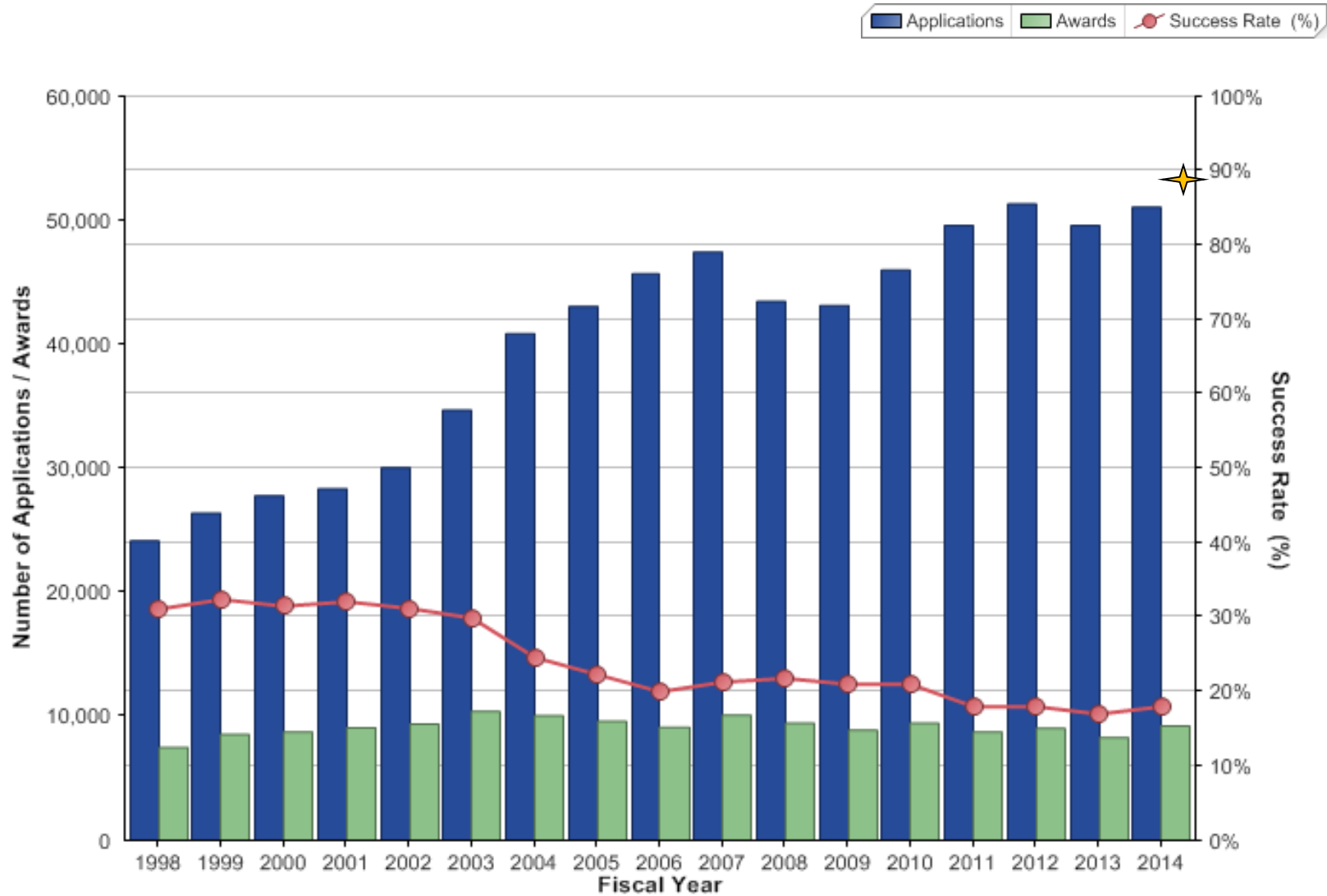

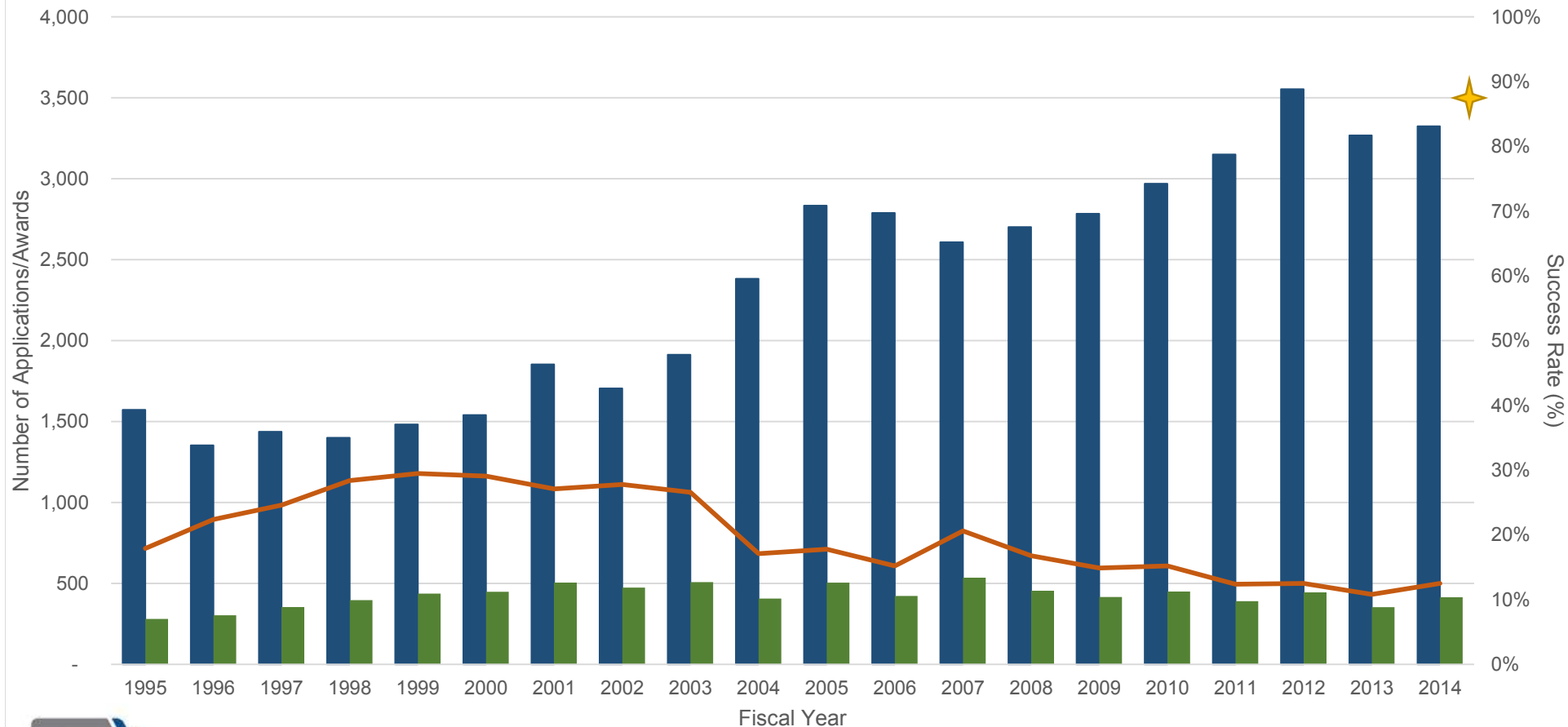

Research Projects (RPG) defined as activities (R00,R01,R03,R15,R21,R22,R23,R29, R33,R34,R35,R36,R37,R55,R56,RL1,RL2,RL5,RL9,P01,P42, PN1,UC1,UC7,U01,U19,U34,UH2,UH3,UM1,DP1,DP2,DP3,DP4,DP5,RC1,RC2, RC3,RC4,UA5,UC1,UC2,UC3,UC4,RF1,UF1,PM1,RM1)

FY 2009 and 2010 exclude awards made under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) and all ARRA solicited applications and awards. An estimate for FY 2015 RPG applications shows 53599 NIH applications and 3551 NICHD applications, These numbers are subject to change.

Enhancing Reproducibility through Rigor & Transparency: Guiding Principles

- Clarify NIH's long-standing expectations regarding rigor and transparency and how we would like to see this described in applications
- Raise awareness and begin culture shifts in the scientific community
- Prompt applicants to consider issues that they may have previously down-played or ignored, which may have a detrimental effect on the quality of the science they produce



Enhancing Reproducibility through Rigor & Transparency: Guiding Principles

- Improve the way that applicants describe their work; provide sufficient information for reviewers
- As always, ensure that NIH is investing in the best science and minimizing unnecessary burden



Pending OMB approval, instructions for applicants will be available in Fall 2015 for applications due January 2016, with awards in Fall 2016
